Bongbong: Dad's legacy will boost my candidacy

MANILA — The son of the late Philippine dictator Ferdinand Marcos said Wednesday his father's legacy would help rather than hamper his own bid for the vice presidency.

Sen. Ferdinand Marcos Jr. said his surname was the "greatest blessing," his first public comments since announcing Monday he would run as an independent next May.

Marcos Sr. was accused of large-scale corruption and massive human rights abuses during his tumultuous two decades in

Leni Robredo will have a good chance of winning the vice presidential race in 2016, being the only woman in a field of six contenders. Belmonte said he was initially rooting for Sen. Alan Peter Cayetano to be the administration's vice presidential bet but the Liberal Party (LP) chose

Philippine Airlines shifts to wider Boeing plane for Manila to New York flights

MANILA — Philippine Airlines (PAL) is set to shift to the Boeing 777-300 aircraft from the Airbus A340 plane for its Manila to New York flights later this month to increase seat capacity. In a statement, PAL said it will start using the 370-seater B777-300 as operating fleet on the Manila to New York service which has a stopover in Vancouver, Canada beginning Oct. 26.
